

Regularity, Loan Signs, and Personal Pronoun Number Incorporation

Regularity


Regularity differs from **duration** in that it shows something happening again and again instead of continuously. Many action verbs can be repeated to show a repeated or regular action. Frequently, the certain facial expressions are used which can alter the meaning completely (as always!).

EXAMPLES:



**Go regularly
(Attend)**

Julie attends our meetings regularly.



Coughing again and again


I heard John cough and cough last night.

'with ease, pleasure'



I regularly go to...
OR
I attend...

'with attention, care, deliberately'



I often shop...
OR
I regularly shop...

'without attention, carelessly, foolishly'



I regularly foolishly shop
OR
I often foolishly shop...

'with effort or difficulty'



I told him again and again

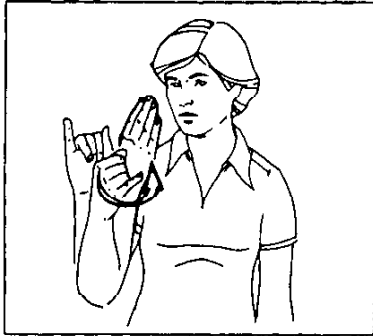
A. DEAF GROUP I LIKE GO-THERE-REPEATEDLY CHAT.

Loan Signs

Loan Signs are signs which borrow or loan a part of a sign or partially fingerspelling to for that sign.

EXAMPLES:



J + B = JOB



A + P + T = APPARTMENT

OTHER EXAMPLES:

C + R = CAR

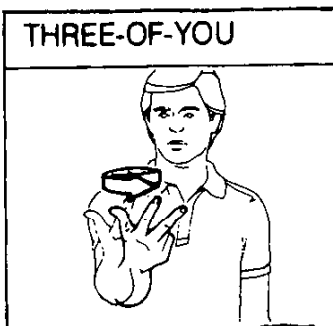
C + L + B = CLUB

B + N + K = BANK

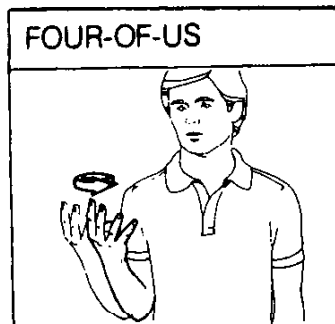
Personal Pronoun Incorporation

Pronouns are incorporated into a number handshape to indicate the number of people involved and who exactly is involved.

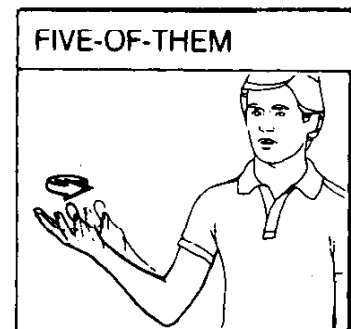
NOTE: Remember when one wishes to include oneself in the pronoun, the hand is held close to the body.



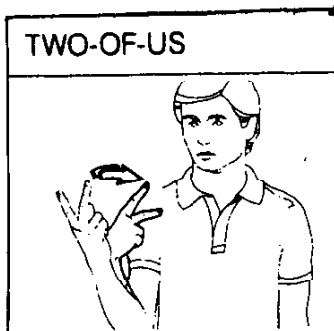
THREE-OF-YOU



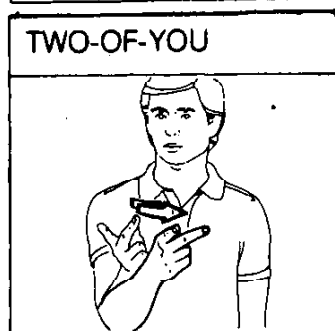
FOUR-OF-US



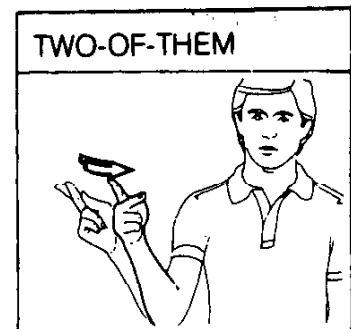
FIVE-OF-THEM
